We will continue on from India to the UK for a couple of weeks to set up our board in the UK and Europe, with the plan of sending mission teams from the UK in the future. Thank you to everyone who personally supports us, an orphan, a student, or a pastor. Your faithfulness is making a difference and we are so grateful.

This is a great opportunity for spiritual growth, and we know that those who can make the trip will never be the same.

In our last update, we shared some of the breakthroughs that we have been experiencing in our church, children's program and ministry overall. You might remember that we have been understaffed and in need of more equipment. Since our last letter, we have hired another secretary; bought another computer; bought more chairs for the church; accrued two volunteers to help in computer work and in counseling.

This has helped us keep up with the increase of work, allowing us to do a better job for God and the people whom we serve. Since our last update, we have also hosted two conferences: one for our church and the other for our city, which were both very successful.

The first conference, called the "Heart Clinic," dealt with generational curses, the spirit of captivity and taking the steps towards freedom. In this conference, a 20-year-old woman was set free from a tormenting spirit of condemnation and shame. The woman's mother testified that after the conference, the whole atmosphere in her house changed, including the young lady.

There is a lot more to say and an update just can't cover the exciting life we experience serving God in Guatemala. Thank you all very much for your friendship, prayers and financial support. We know that God is pleased with the love and care you give to my family, Mike Black Ministries and the people of Guatemala.

First, we would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their prayers and support. We have a good report concerning our 5-year-old boy, Godwill. For those who have not heard, Godwill comes from an area where there is a high rate of a very aggressive form of cancer. Unfortunately, Godwill was diagnosed with this cancer several weeks ago. It was caught early and treatment was started right away. He has responded to the chemo and is doing really well. Praise God!! The doctors are really optimistic about his full recovery and, of course, we know that Jehovah Rapha (means "the Lord is our healer") is intimately involved in Godwill's life and he is healed! An additional good report is that all expenses except transportation costs are covered by a South African grant. We are so grateful that the Lord brought Godwill to us. The chances of him getting care in time if he was in the village would have been pretty low.

We have been busy since the last update. We have put in a speed bump in front of the children's home property, installed swings, opened a library in a room at the children's home (they love the books!), handed out Operation Christmas Child boxes (the children loved them; that was a lot of fun), and held an Easter outreach at the children's home for our children and the neighborhood children.

We are also preparing to work with a group of orphans from a nearby village orphanage. They are coming with a group of older orphans to do a project at our home. They will be staying for two nights, and will also be doing Bible stories and some crafts. We have supported them and had a lot of contact with this orphanage. We are excited to be opening up our children's home so that their children can do an outreach during their spring break. We really believe in teaching children the value of Christian service and a life of giving. It is a blessing to be able to be a part of this.

Thank you again for all of your support. Please remember to pray for Godwill as his treatments come to an end. Also, pray for our "Ma" at the children's home, as she was diagnosed with heart problems. She is continuing to get stronger every day. We know that God will see her through this time and strengthen her for the work that the Lord has for her here in Cameroon. She is such a blessing to the children at the home.
